NACMPA SPONSORED PROGRAMS

Malaysia Meeting (June 17-20, 2009)

A four-day AAPM ISEP sponsored symposium in Malaysia with the theme, "Image-Based Technology in Radiation Oncology" was held at the Legend Hotel, Kuala Lumpur the capital of Malaysia from June 17th to 20th, 2009. The local organizational sponsors are the Malaysian Oncological Society (MOS) and the Malaysian Association of Medical Physics (MAMP).

The objectives of the symposium are multifolds: (a) to share the US experience in the implementation of image-based technology in radiation therapy in particular, three dimensional (3-D) treatment planning, conformal radiation therapy, and intensity-modulated radiation therapy with the radiation oncology community in Malaysia, (b) to expose the AAPM organization to the Malaysian radiation oncology community, (c) to exchange information on the educational and training programs for medical physicists, certification, licensure, and maintenance programs of qualified medical physicists, and (d) to provide an integrated opportunity where the radiation oncologists and the medical physicists attended the same symposium to exchange knowledge and collaborate on the use of modern radiation therapy equipment and treatment techniques. NACMPA attendees are Drs. Cheng Saw, Andy Wu and Jack Yang.

Great Wall Meeting (November 23-26, 2008)

The Great wall 2008 meeting was hosted in Beijing during Nov. 23-26 in 2008. The theme of this congress is safety and quality in medicine: new challenge for medical physicists. Major topics include image-guided radiotherapy, bio-functional aiming, 3D and IMRT, Monte Carlo methods, radiation safety and quality, imaging processing methods and radiobiological modeling. There were more than 30 members of NACMPA had involved planning and participation this meeting. Dr. Charlie Ma and Professor Hu are the co-chairmen of this meeting with more than 350 attendees.

China Meeting (August 11-15, 2009)

A five-day Quality Assurance workshop of Radiotherapy Equipment will be hosted at ShenYang, China during August 11-15. Purposes of this workshop are to exchange and improve the collaboration between two societies. The focused topics include all of the radiation treatment equipment selection, commissioning and routine maintenance. The local organizer is Dr. Jianrong Dai from CSMP and Dr. Tan Li from Liaoning Cancer Hospital and Institute. This meeting will provide a platform for the modern QA/QC progress with theoretical and hand-on workshop for the Chinese physicists. NACMPA attendees are Drs. Charlie Ma, Jack Yang, Yong Yang, and Tim Zhu.

Partners-In-Physics (PIP) Program

NACMPA had been supporting the PIP program of the AAPM by sponsoring up to 15 medical physicists per year from developing countries in the Asian Pacific region.
